## Thirty-Second Sunday In Ordinary Time

### The Pastor Jots It Down:

I thank all of you who came out for the lectures on the REVISED ROMAN MISSAL given by both Father Gournas and I. In addition to these there have been several conferences sponsored by our Diocese. Our choirs have worked hard in preparing music for the new translation. We are doing well in singing the revised GLORIA and the HOLY. This week we will introduce the LAMB OF GOD. These changes are meant to be more than just words – it has all been done to help us to pray the Mass better with a greater understanding of the spirituality and beauty of our worship.

We will be in a learning process for some time, but I encourage all of you to attend a final conference given by MR GERARD HALL, Director of the Diocesan Office of Worship **on Thursday evening, November 10<sup>th</sup>, at 7:00 in the Church.** Mr. Hall will present an overview of the revisions of the Roman Missal; an explanation of why the revision; and an understanding of how we as a parish may best proceed with the implementation. **REMEMBER**, the revised Roman Missal, third edition, takes effect in exactly four weeks at which time all the revised texts must be used.

It was a good visit with our seminarians at St. Charles Borromeo Seminary in Philadelphia. Evan Waniewski received his cassock on Cassock Day and he was beaming! I visited with Stephen Cartwright and Tom Duggan, our seminarians these past two summers. Tom will be ordained to the Diaconate this coming May – he is now only a year and a half from priesthood. Steve, Tom and Evan all need our continued prayers and support, as do all our seminarians. I was able to see each of our 20 men studying at St. Charles and they all seemed happy in their pursuit of their priestly vocation.

I was representing our Diocese on this special day and it was a wonderful experience for me. To think, here I am nearing the end of my ministry, (only God knows how many years I have left) separated by 50 years from Evan and the others who are just starting out. I looked over the congregation of Seminarians and my heart was filled with hope for the future of our Church. We all need to pray to our loving God that many more men will answer the call to ordained ministry – that the pews of St. Charles Seminary Chapel will be filled once again. At the same time we pray for an increase of vocations to the Consecrated life of Religious women and men – Sisters and Brothers. God will hear and answer our prayers.

Finally, I am pleased to tell you that Father Victor Gournas has been appointed by Bishop Burbidge as an Assistant Vocation Director for our region. Pray God that his work and example will encourage young men and women to consider a priestly and religious vocation.

# ROMAN MISSAL

**NOTE:** Mr. Gerard Hall, Director of the Diocesan Office of Divine Worship will give an overview of the Roman Missal Thursday, November 10th at 7:00PM in the church.

## WHAT'S DIFFERENT ABOUT THE NEW MISSAL?

The most noticeable change in this new Mass book is the wording of the prayer texts. The new translation more closely corresponds to the original Latin, is richer in imagery, and more closely aligned with its sources in Scripture. It tries to express more authentically the scriptural roots of many of the texts we use at Mass. As you hear and pray these new texts, enter into a spirit of prayer and lift your hearts to God. This is a rich opportunity for us to renew our sense of mystery and awe, to deepen our Eucharistic spirituality and to learn more about the Mass. For it is at the Mass, that we, the Body of Christ, are nourished in word and sacrament to build the kingdom of God.

Within the lifetime of many of us, we have celebrated Mass from three different versions of the Missal. The translations are somewhat different, but the “new” Mass is still the same Mass! Each version of the Missal helps us to celebrate better.

Change is always difficult for us. We are comfortable with the ways we have, and any change challenges us to let go of the familiar. Most changes are good; they help us grow, bring us new insight, and enable us to be creative and responsive in new ways. When the changes to the Mass (especially the prayer texts and people’s responses) are implemented on November, 27th, it can be a positive experience of liturgical prayer, encounter with Christ, and lead to a deeper appreciation of the sacred.
