The Pastor Jots It Down:

The first and second days of November are very important days for us Catholics.

November 1st is the **FEAST OF ALL SAINTS**, a **HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION** on which all of us are required to worship at Mass. This is the feast of everyone in Heaven, those myriads of people who have gone before us, who will never be canonized, but have lived a good life, fought the good fight and are now with the Father in the Kingdom. I invite you to sit quietly and think of all the saints who have crossed your path in your lifetime.

November 2nd is **ALL SOULS DAY**, a day on which we are invited to pray for all of our beloved dead; for all the poor souls in purgatory; for all the faithful departed; that they will truly be among the role of Saints. At the 7:00PM Mass on Wednesday we will pray for all of the St. Paul Parish Family who died this past year. There will be a special memorial ceremony during the Mass as a candle is lighted for each of our beloved dead.

In your envelope packet you will find a special envelope for **ALL SOULS DAY**. You are invited to write the names of your beloved dead on these envelopes and they will be placed on the Altar for the entire month of November. The special intention of every Mass offered in the Parish during November will be for the Faithful Departed, especially for those named in the envelopes on the Altar. These envelopes may be placed in the offertory baskets at any time or mailed into the office.

Another holy practice is to visit a cemetery on All Souls Day. The Church grants, under the usual conditions, a plenary indulgence to all who visit a cemetery on this day and pray for the dead.

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)

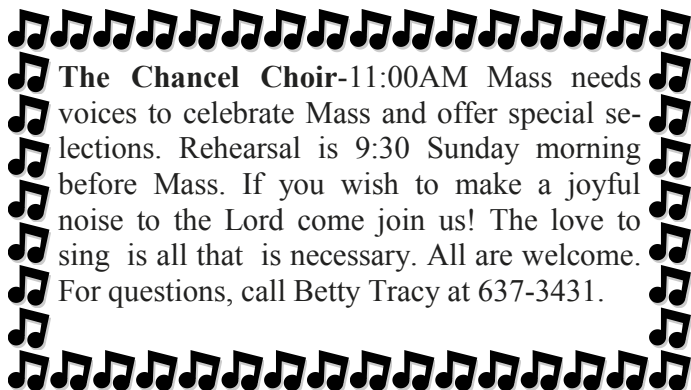
