RESPECT LIFE SEMINAR

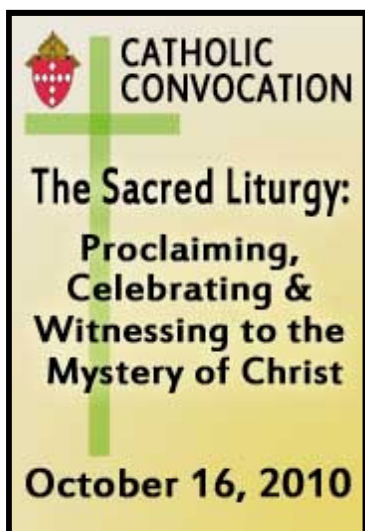
