I may have done a disservice by being so insistent that our parish school be called ST. PAUL CATHOLIC SCHOOL instead of ST PAUL EDUCATION CENTER in that it has given a misconception to some of our parish family who now think that the building is solely a School Building. I did not give enough thought to announcing this to the total Parish Family and thus I did not discuss this as I should have done.

Monsignor Jones was wise when he called the building an Education Center, for there are many parish functions that go on in that building other than the School.

First, there is the Faith Formation Program for public and private school students of the Parish. This is almost every Sunday for nine months of the year.

There are programs sponsored by St. Paul Catholic School that are open to all children of the parish such as the various music programs.

Then there are the many parish meetings that take place in the Library; the Parish Advisory Council, the Safe Child Program, the Pastor's Bible Study and others from time to time.

Other affiliated groups meet in the Library such as the COURT MONSIGNOR MICHAEL A. ERWIN OF THE CATHOLIC DAUGHTERS OF AMERICA.

I talk about this now because it came up in the Parish Financial Council meeting last week. We talked about some repairs needed in the building and we all realized that this is truly a multi-purpose parish building and we shouldn't think that the expense belongs only to St. Paul Catholic School.

YES, I am very proud of our St. Paul Catholic School and want it to be known as such and at the same time I want all of us to be aware of our total responsibility for maintaining the building.,

Blessed Sacrament Congregation

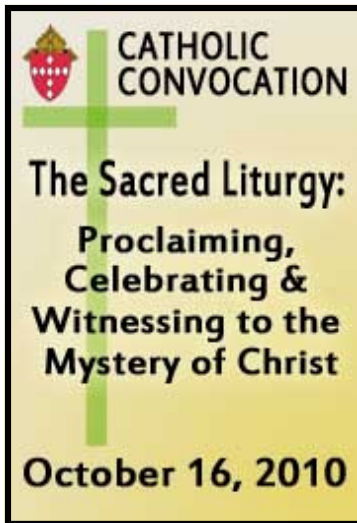
