Notes from Mrs. Mahoney

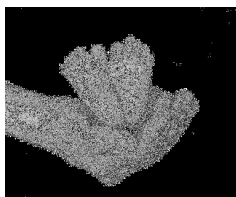

Dear St. Paul Parish,
