Blessed Sacrament Congregation

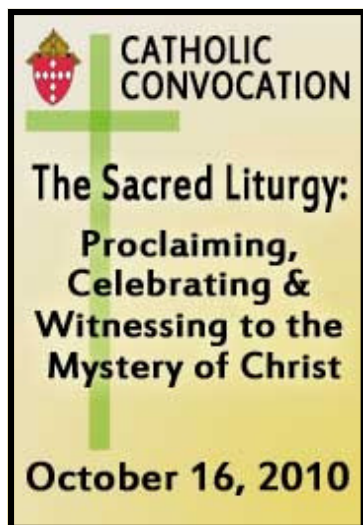
