People are beginning to ask, ‘when are we going to start talking about the changes in translations in the Roman Missal to be introduced the first Sunday of Advent?’

This past week Mr. Gerard Hall, the Diocesan Director of Liturgy, gave a very enlightening presentation to our musicians and announced that we would begin singing the new translation of the greetings at the beginning of Mass and the Glory to God in September.

I will give a three part workshop covered on August 10, 17, and 24. The workshop will be repeated three times each of the days, 10:00 AM, 2:00 PM and 7:00 PM. Father Gournas will have a workshop in October according to the same schedule.

We also have a nine week series of bulletin inserts explaining the history and purpose of the Liturgical translations.

It is my prayer that by slowly introducing the revised parts of the Mass and with the workshops and bulletin inserts we will all be well prepared for the changes in the Mass by the start of Advent.

On Thursday, June 30, 2011, after an eight year struggle, Gov. Bev Perdue signed into law House Bill 289: "Authorize Various Specialty License Plates" that will make available to NC motorists a "**Choose Life**" license plate. Bishops Burbidge and Jugis have expressed their gratitude to Gov. Perdue and the legislators for their support and effort on this cause.

The annual charge for the "**Choose Life**" plate will be \$25. A portion of that fee will be sent to the Carolina Pregnancy Care Fellowship who will distribute the funds annually to non-profit agencies that provide pregnancy services eg. counseling, ultra sound, etc. No money will be distributed to any agency that promotes, counsels or refers women for abortion.

North Carolinians can request the new plate when they renew their license plates at the Motor Vehicle Bureau.

Thank you all for the lives of the precious little ones that will be saved.
