I thank all those who helped in last week's Ministry Fair. The Church and School working together as one Parish Family showed off our many parish ministries and provided us with nourishing food for the body. Again, thanks to all who worked and all who came.

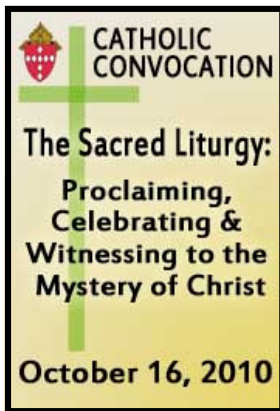
CVS FLU CLINIC
