The Pastor Jots it Down



Among the reading I did this week while in the hospital was the autobiography of Joe Eszterhas written after his conversion and a complete change of lifestyle. In the early part of the book where Joe is speaking of his need to make up for his past life, he quotes his Pastor, "Last week I attended a conference on Stewardship... One of the workshops I attended was "Stewardship and Deeping Spirituality in the Parish." It spoke about the four characteristics of a good steward. These were so powerful I wanted to share them with you. We must be grateful. We should also be responsible. We are called to be generous. God has blessed us with good purpose. Each one of us has something to give—if only a smile, a kindness, an hour of work, a note of support, or a promise of prayers. Lastly, we are challenged to make a return to the Lord with increase. God will ask us, "What did you do with your life" How did you use the gifts, the talents, and the abilities I gave you?" This struck me rather forcefully, too, and I had to share it with you.

I have been out of the hospital for a few hours and I am sitting with my leg propped up as it will be for a week. The healing of my leg seems to be going well and I may be able to some Liturgical Ministry this weekend. I thank all of you for your prayers, assistance and concern.

November 1 and 2 are BIG Days. Not days of Obligation but Holy Days never-the-less. There will be four (4) Masses on Monday, **The Feast of All Saints**-all of those who have gone before us and now are in the Kingdom. This is our feast day-few of us will be canonized, but I pray that all of us will make it into the Kingdom prepared for us by the Lord. Tuesday is the **Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed**. The Bible tells us "It is a Holy and Wholesome thought to pray for the dead." We do this at every Mass but we do it in a special way on All Souls Day. You are invited to place the names of your beloved dead on the envelope provided and these will be placed on the Altar for special remembrance during the entire month of November.

Next weekend, November 6th and 7th, our second collection will be taken up for the Church Debt Reduction Fund. Your generosity is greatly appreciated.

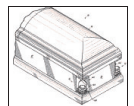
CATHOLIC COMMUNICATION CAMPAIGN
